Hello everybody and welcome back!

It was so lovely to see our 1-6s return yesterday and fill our classrooms. Schools are odd places during the holidays and it's not until we have our students return that the beautiful energy they bring remind us why we have chosen this beautiful place to work.

It was also amazing to welcome our new Foundation students today! Such big hats and big school bags! They all settled so well into the classroom and spent the morning getting to know their classmates and teachers. The first day of primary school is a huge day for students and parents!

New Staff: As well as welcoming new students, we are also welcoming Tarsh Randle to our staff! Tarsh will be working in our junior grades as Education Support. We are very lucky to have Tarsh join us and share her expertise and passion for supporting young people on their learning journey.

Bushfire Preparedness: On Tuesday we had our first EXTREME weather forecast for the term. This triggered a RELOCATION Day for us and school staff had to work remotely due to the MMPS site being closed for the day. During term 1 and 4 I receive twice-daily weather forecasts directly from the Department of Education's Emergency Management department. These can sometimes vary from what is publicly published. If a day is forecast to be EXTREME you will receive an emergency text message from Compass and you will need to reply to the school mobile with whether or not your child will be attending school and relocating OR if you will be keeping your child home to enact your own bushfire safety plans. I am very aware of the nature of bushfire risk in Mount Macedon and fully support your decision to enact your own fire plans.

Holiday Works: Over the holiday break we had lots of work completed onsite. Many of these are able to be completed due to your generous donations to the *Buildings and Grounds fund*. Some of the works completed included:

- Mural artwork by Candela
- Installed new cupboards doors in junior classrooms
- Library desk upgrade
- New teacher iPads, Apple TV adapters
- 30 new student computers
- Outdoor classroom deck/fairy garden completed
- Local resident donated and installed nets on our basketball hoops

Fire Safety upgrades

- Upgrade phone system
- Cleared guttering (fire season)
- Upgrade to our roof sprinkler plumbing
- Installed new bubbler taps
- Roof safety check
- General grounds maintenance

The BBQ will be kicking off from 5:00pm where a sausage sizzle will provide dinner, everything else is BYO. We cannot wait to see you all there!

Annual privacy reminder for our school community

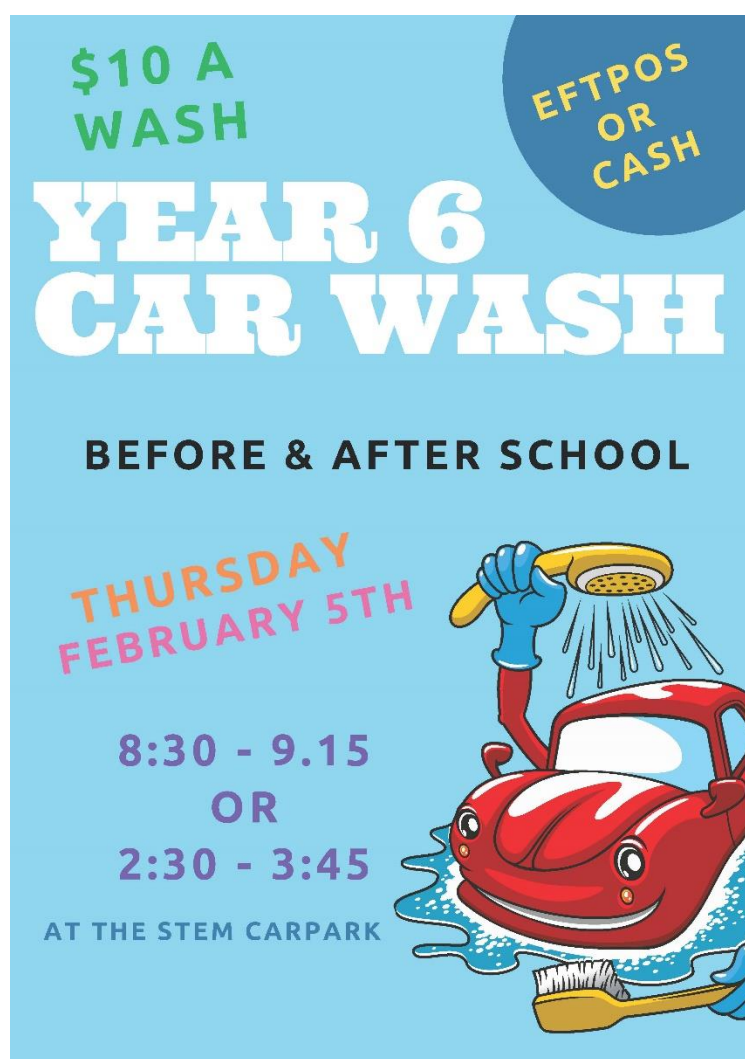




